THOUGHT FROM FR. HUGH TUDOR-FOLEY

A TIME TO CELEBRATE

I have always thought that the Church starts the year three different times. My experience over the last week or so has caused me to add a fourth. We begin the three year cycle of Sunday lessons from Scripture around the first of December, Advent. We are on a calendar fiscal year beginning January 1st. We really begin our program year about the time school starts in the early fall.

Now I am adding to that - as a beginning - our Annual Meeting where an election is held and the business of change in the Parish is shared. That meeting and the now two Vestry Meetings that have followed reflect the energy and excitement, the looking to our future, a real sense of what God has in mind for us. I am grateful to all who stood for election by the parish to the vestry and other positions of leadership.

We have a solid and thoughtful plan for adult education both during the Lenten season and the Easter season, which I believe will be a moving spiritual experience.

The diversity of opportunities here at All Saints means that wherever you are on your journey with and towards our loving God in Jesus Christ, there is something here for you. Our committees continue to meet and a lot is being accomplished.

As I said at the Annual Meeting, much happens here that doesn't make the "front page" of all our communications tools. Incidentally, if you aren't a "friend" of All Saints on Facebook, I ask that you do and that you encourage your friends to do so as well. We send out an "e-blast" every week and we have discovered that only about 40% of the 500 that the message goes to, actually open that mail. Once again there is information to be found, to be shared with others. In a few days our new website will be up and running. In the midst of all that is going on I am grateful for the extra time and thought that has gone into its preparation.

Our Transition Task Force and our Rector Search Committee also continue to contribute time and thoughtfulness into the work assigned to them.

All of this, written in gratitude, finishes up with the place where I began: **It is a time to celebrate!**

If I speak in the tongues of mortals and of angels, but do not have love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. If I give away all my possessions, and if I hand over my body so that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing.

Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends. But as for prophecies, they will come to an end; as for tongues, they will cease; as for knowledge, it will come to an end. For we know only in part, and we prophesy only in part; but when the complete comes, the partial will come to an end. When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child; when I became an adult, I put an end to childish ways. For now we see in a mirror, dimly, but then we will see face to face. Now I know only in part; then I will know fully, even as I have been fully known. And now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love.

He said to them, "Doubtless you will quote to me this proverb, 'Doctor, cure yourself!' And you will say, 'Do here also in your hometown the things that we have heard you did at Capernaum.'" cleansed except Naaman the Syrian." When they heard this, all in the synagogue were filled with rage. They got up, drove him out of the town, and led him to the brow of the hill on which their town was built, so that they might hurl him off the cliff. But he passed through the midst of them and went on his way.




