At a Loss for Words

Our Book of Common Prayer does, on so many occasions, give us words to say help me when I cannot find words to say.

“Help us, O God, in the midst of things we cannot understand....”

As I was leaving for Church this morning I walked past the building office and realized that our manager was in distressed. So I stopped and asked her what was going on. She said that a young man who lived with his mother in our building was shot and killed last night. Also that she was going up to see his mother and didn't really know what to say. I said, “Give her a hug and just listen, let her know that she is in our prayers and let me know what I can do.”

As I walked out to my car I said, well I actually yelled, to God for help. That is when the words from our burial service came to mind, “Help me, O God, in the midst of things I cannot understand....”

There is so much happening - violence, anger, more violence - that day by day it is difficult to grasp it all.

I feel the need to do more. Yes, I am praying more frequently but there is also a need for action. So I do include in my prayers, “God, let me know what more I can do in this world, your earthly kingdom, to respond actively to all this.”

So, let us pray for each other, for all those who have died in senseless violence, for our nation and for our church and for the world.

And let God guide each of us to work for peace for all. Amen.



A READING FROM GENESIS 18:20-32



A READING FROM COLOSSIANS 2:6-19

As you have received Christ Jesus the Lord, continue to live your lives in him, rooted and built up in him and established in the faith, just as you were taught, abounding in thanksgiving.

See to it that no one takes you captive through philosophy and empty deceit, according to human tradition, according to the elemental spirits of the universe, and not according to Christ. For in him the whole fullness of deity dwells bodily, and you have come to fullness in him, who is the head of every ruler and authority. In him also you were circumcised with a spiritual circumcision, by putting off the body of the flesh in the circumcision of Christ; when you were buried with him in baptism, you were also raised with him through faith in the power of God, who raised him from the dead. And when you were dead in trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, God made you alive together with him, when he forgave us all our trespasses, erasing the record that stood against us with its legal demands. He set this aside, nailing it to the cross. He disarmed the rulers and authorities and made a

public example of them, triumphing over them in it.

Therefore do not let anyone condemn you in matters of food and drink or of observing festivals, new moons, or sabbaths. These are only a shadow of what is to come, but the substance belongs to Christ. Do not let anyone disqualify you, insisting on self-abasement and worship of angels, dwelling on visions, puffed up without cause by a human way of thinking, and not holding fast to the head, from whom the whole body, nourished and held together by its ligaments and sinews, grows with a growth that is from God.

Deacon The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke 11:1-13.

If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!"

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.
