Brothers and sisters, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh-- for if you live according to the flesh, you will die; but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live. For all who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God. For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received a spirit of adoption. When we cry, "Abba! Father!" it is that very Spirit bearing witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ-- if, in fact, we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him.

I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory about to be revealed to us. For the creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the children of God; for the creation was subjected to futility, not of its own will but by the will of the one who subjected it, in hope that the creation itself will be set free from its bondage to decay and will obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God. We know that the whole creation has been groaning in labor pains until now; and not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the first fruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly while we wait for adoption, the redemption of our bodies. For in hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what is seen? But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience.

Just as the weeds are collected and burned up with fire, so will it be at the end of the age. Celebrant Will you be responsible for seeing that Luna is brought up in the Christian faith and life?

Presenters I will, with God’s help.

Celebrant Will you by your prayers and witness help her to grow into the full stature of Christ?

Presenters I will, with God’s help.

Celebrant Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

Presenters I renounce them.

Celebrant Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

Presenters I renounce them.

Celebrant Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

Presenters I renounce them.

Celebrant Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Savior?

Presenters I do.

Celebrant Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

Presenters I do.

Celebrant Do you promise to follow and obey him as your Lord?

Presenters I do.

The People stand, and the celebrant addresses the congregation, saying

Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support Luna in her life in Christ?

People **We will.**

Celebrant Let us join with Luna who is committing herself to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

BAPTISMAL COVENANT

Celebrant Do you believe in God the Father?

People **I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.**

Celebrant Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

People **I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.**

He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary.

He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried

He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again.

He ascended into heaven,

and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Celebrant Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

People **I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.**

Celebrant Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers ?

People **I will, with God's help.**

Celebrant Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

People **I will, with God's help.**

Celebrant Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?

People **I will, with God's help.**

Celebrant Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?

People **I will, with God's help.**

Celebrant Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?
People **I will, with God's help.**

PRAYERS FOR THE CANDIDATE

Leader Bring her to the fullness of your peace and glory.

People **Lord, hear our prayer.**

The Celebrant says

Grant, O Lord, that all who are baptized into the death of Jesus Christ your Son may live in the power of his resurrection and look for him to come again in glory; who lives and reigns now and for ever. **Amen.**

THANKSGIVING OVER THE WATER

Celebrant The Lord be with you.

People **And also with you.**

Celebrant Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People **It is right to give him thanks and praise.**

Celebrant We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life. We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Now sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those here are cleansed from sin and born again and may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior. To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and forever. **Amen.**

THE BAPTISM

The candidate is presented by name to the Celebrant, who then pours water upon the candidate, saying:
Luna, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon this your servant, the forgiveness of sin, and have raised her to the new life of grace. Sustain her, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give her an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. **Amen.**

Then the Priest places a hand on the person's head, marking on the forehead the sign of the cross and saying
Luna, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever.

People loudly **Amen.**

Celebrant Let us welcome the newly baptized.

We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.

2017 SECOND QUARTER FINANCIAL UPDATE

A major highlight in the second quarter was a significant reduction in the principal balance of the loan we owe to the Diocese of Southeast Florida. From a balance exceeding \$225,000 at year-end 2016, we are down to \$116,000 at June 30th, thanks to capital campaign gifts and ongoing monthly principal payments from operating funds. We hope to reduce the balance to \$100,000 by next summer and will convert to a comfortable amortization schedule of 10 years or less, depending on the actual balance, at that time. In the interim, lower principal translates into a monthly savings of \$500 in the interest expense line.

In the second quarter we also received Diocesan approval for changes to our property insurance for savings of almost \$28,000 against annual premium of \$85,000. The Church Insurance Company (a subsidiary of the Episcopal Church's Church Pension Group) generously backdated the changes to the start of the premium year (October 2016) so we will realize the full savings in 2017. We also anticipate a further change for additional savings of \$8,500. Although we will likely see an increase in the cost of coverage in the next premium year, these structural changes to our policy and the related savings represent the equivalent of a \$750,000 legacy gift to the endowment. Enormous thanks are owed to Assistant Treasurer Jim Gross for the persistence and hard work that secured this seminal change to our operations.

Despite positive changes and our many financial blessings, we face a significant operating deficit this year. Committed pledges and anticipated plate and other revenue, including endowment revenue, fall well short of ongoing expenses. Total operating revenue for the year from all sources is projected at \$620,000 vs expenses of \$685,000 (average monthly expenses are \$57,000). The leadership is working hard to mitigate the shortfall, limiting discretionary expenditures when and where possible. For example, the cost of refitting space for the nursery will be less than \$1,800 thanks to careful management by Junior Warden Terry Colli, and the contributions of time and talent by parishioners toward this important ministry. We have \$52,000 in reserves to help offset the deficit in the short term, but we will absorb those reserves before the end of the year without some other influx of funds. These reserves are the remainder of an unrestricted gift from the estate of a deceased parishioner and would clearly be better devoted to future ministry rather than operations. Accordingly, your continued generosity and prayerful consideration of your gifts to the Church are needed as we finish out 2017 and look forward to 2018.
