If I speak in the tongues of mortals and of angels, but do not have love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. If I give away all my possessions, and if I hand over my body so that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing.

Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends. But as for prophecies, they will come to an end; as for tongues, they will cease; as for knowledge, it will come to an end. For we know only in part, and we prophesy only in part; but when the complete comes, the partial will come to an end. When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child; when I became an adult, I put an end to childish ways. For now we see in a mirror, dimly, but then we will see face to face. Now I know only in part; then I will know fully, even as I have been fully known. And now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love.

Deacon Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke 4:21-30.

In the synagogue at Nazareth, Jesus read from the book of the prophet Isaiah, and began to say, "Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing." All spoke well

of him and were amazed at the gracious words that came from his mouth. They said, "Is not this Joseph's son?" He said to them, "Doubtless you will quote to me this proverb, 'Doctor, cure yourself!' And you will say, 'Do here also in your hometown the things that we have heard you did at Capernaum.'" And he said, "Truly I tell you, no prophet is accepted in the prophet's hometown. But the truth is, there were many widows in Israel in the time of Elijah, when the heaven was shut up three years and six months, and there was a severe famine over all the land; yet Elijah was sent to none of them except to a widow at Zarephath in Sidon. There were also many lepers in Israel in the time of the prophet Elisha, and none of them was cleansed except Naaman the Syrian." When they heard this, all in the synagogue were filled with rage. They got up, drove him out of the town, and led him to the brow of the hill on which their town was built, so that they might hurl him off the cliff. But he passed through the midst of them and went on his way.

Intercessor In you, O God, have we taken refuge: Incline your ear to us and bring your loving presence to those for whom we pray, especially those on our All Saints prayer list; for Michael who will receive communion at home this week; and for those we name either silently or aloud. *(Pause for quiet reflection)*

You are our strong rock; you have sustained us from our birth: Hear our grateful hearts as we pray in thanksgiving, especially for our Vestry and welcoming Lisa, Pete, Zule, Daniel and Richard as new Vestry members; for those celebrating birthdays and anniversaries this week; and for those we name either silently or aloud.

You call all people to know you fully because in you all people are fully known: We commend to your mercy those who have died, that they may see you face to face, especially those we name either silently or aloud. *(Pause for quiet reflection)*

You are our hope, O God;

People **our praise shall be always of you.**

Celebrant Gracious and everliving God, let your people abide in faith, hope, and love, that we may share in Christ's victory and be so filled with the abundance of your infinite love that the scripture may be fulfilled in us and that all people may be united in the power of your loving Spirit, through Jesus Christ our Savior. **Amen.**
