THE GOSPEL OF OUR LORD ACCORDING TO LUKE

Deacon **The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke 14:1,7-14.**

On one occasion when Jesus was going to the house of a leader of the Pharisees to eat a meal on the sabbath, they were watching him closely.

When he noticed how the guests chose the places of honor, he told them a parable.

"When you are invited by someone to a wedding banquet, do not sit down at the place of honor, in case someone more distinguished than you has been invited by your host; and the host who invited both of you may come and say to you, 'Give this person your place,' and then in disgrace you would start to take the lowest place. But when you are invited, go and sit down at the lowest place, so that when your host comes, he may say to you, 'Friend, move up higher!'; then you will be honored in the presence of all who sit at the table with you. For all who exalt themselves will be

humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted."

He said also to the one who had invited him, "When you give a luncheon or a dinner, do not invite your friends or your brothers or your relatives or rich neighbors, in case they may invite you in return, and you would be repaid. But when you give a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, and the blind. And you will be blessed, because they cannot repay you, for you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous."

THE NICENE CREED

God is our helper;

People **therefore we will not fear.**

Intercessor Gracious and compassionate God, remember those in prison; rescue any person who may face torture; guide all couples into the paths of faithfulness; heal the sick, and honor our prayers of intercession for all who look to you in need, especially and all those on our All Saints prayer list and for those we name either silently or aloud. *(pause for quiet reflection)*

Hear us as we offer our sacrifice of praise to you O God, giving thanks especially for those celebrating birthdays and anniversaries this week and for those we name either silently or aloud. *(pause for quiet reflection)*

The righteous will be kept in everlasting remembrance; receive into your heavenly banquet those who have died, especially for those we name either silently or aloud.

(pause for quiet reflection)

God is our helper;

People **therefore we will not fear.**

Celebrant Holy and Gracious God, you have shown us through your son Jesus that your steadfast love and compassion are the same yesterday and today and forever: Lead us humbly to your presence, where the meek may hold up their heads with honor; and grant that we may be counted among those who share in your fellowship of blessing, in the unity of your Spirit, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself, and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.
