It is a credit to you if, being aware of God, you endure pain while suffering unjustly. If you endure when you are beaten for doing wrong, what credit is that? But if you endure when you do right and suffer for it, you have God's approval. For to this you have been called, because Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example, so that you should follow in his steps.

When he was abused, he did not return abuse; when he suffered, he did not threaten; but he entrusted himself to the one who judges justly. He himself bore our sins in his body on the cross, so that, free from sins, we might live for righteousness; by his wounds you have been healed. #### **THE GOSPEL OF OUR LORD ACCORDING TO JOHN**

*Gospeller*       The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John 10:1-10.

*People*           **Glory to you, Lord Christ.**

Jesus said, “Very truly, I tell you, anyone who does not enter the sheepfold by the gate but climbs in by another way is a thief and a bandit. The one who enters by the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. The gatekeeper opens the gate for him, and the sheep hear his voice. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. When he has brought out all his own, he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow him because they know his voice. They will not follow a stranger, but they will run from him

because they do not know the voice of strangers.” Jesus used this figure of speech with them, but they did not understand what he was saying to them. So again Jesus said to them, “Very truly, I tell you, I am the gate for the sheep. All who came before me are thieves and bandits; but the sheep did not listen to them. I am the gate. Whoever enters by me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture. The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly.”

## THE NICENE CREED

BCP 358

**We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty,  
maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.**

**We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ,  
the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father,  
God from God, Light from Light,  
true God from true God, begotten, not made,  
of one Being with the Father.  
Through him all things were made.  
For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven:  
by the power of the Holy Spirit  
he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man.  
For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate;  
he suffered death and was buried.  
On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures;  
he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.  
He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead,  
and his kingdom will have no end.**

**We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life,  
who proceeds from the Father and the Son.  
With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified.  
He has spoken through the Prophets.  
We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.  
We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.  
We look for the resurrection of the dead,  
and the life of the world to come. Amen.**

## THE PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE

*Celebrant* Gracious and loving God, you sent Jesus to be the shepherd of your sheep and to guide us along right pathways that we may have lives of security and goodness: Hear our prayers for your whole creation, and lead us into your presence always, as we pray: Guide us along right pathways, for the sake of your Name.

*Intercessor* You have called your Church to be filled with awe and wonder as we praise you with glad and generous hearts: Fill your baptized people with generosity and trust, that we may devote ourselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. Guide us along right pathways

*People* **for the sake of your Name.**

*Intercessor* Let your benevolent hand be upon our leaders and upon all who hold authority in the world, that they may protect your people from thieves and bandits who steal and kill and destroy, so that all your sheep may come in and go out securely, and find good pasture. Guide us along right pathways

*People* **for the sake of your Name.**

*Intercessor* May Christ who suffered for us be present with all who suffer unjustly, to comfort them with the powerful deliverance of your rod and staff. Guide us along right pathways

*People* **for the sake of your Name.**

*Intercessor* Sing your shepherd-song of love to us and to all who live in this community, that everyone will hear the voice of the good shepherd and follow him to green pastures and still waters. Guide us along right pathways

*People* **for the sake of your Name.**

*Intercessor* Let your goodness and mercy surround all who are ill or in any way afflicted, especially all those on our All Saints prayer list and for those we name either silently or aloud. *(Pause for quiet reflection)*

Hear our grateful prayers for your guidance and your gifts, especially for those celebrating birthdays or anniversaries this week and those we name either silently or aloud. *(Pause for quiet reflection)*

Let your resurrection power rescue all who walk through the valley of the shadow of death and lead them to dwell in the house of God forever; we remember those who have died, especially those we name either silently or aloud. *(Pause for quiet reflection)*

Guide us along right pathways

*People* **for the sake of your Name.**

*Celebrant* Gracious God, your Son Jesus is the gate of the sheepfold and the shepherd of your sheep: Lead all humanity by the guidance of his compassionate voice, that everyone may find shelter and abundant life at your welcoming table, and live in the power of your Holy Spirit, forever and ever. **Amen.**

We acclaim you, holy Lord, glorious in power. Your mighty works reveal your wisdom and love. You formed us in your own image, giving the whole world into our care, so that, in obedience to you, our Creator, we might rule and serve all your creatures. When our disobedience took us far from you, you did not abandon us to the power of death. In your mercy you came to our help, so that in seeking you we might find you. Again and again you called us into covenant with you, and through the prophets you taught us to hope for salvation.

Father, you loved the world so much that in the fullness of time you sent your only Son to be our Savior. Incarnate by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, he lived as one of us, yet without sin. To the poor he proclaimed the good news of salvation; to prisoners, freedom; to the sorrowful, joy. To fulfill your purpose he gave himself up to death; and, rising from the grave, destroyed death, and made the whole creation new.

And, that we might live no longer for ourselves, but for him who died and rose for us, he sent the Holy Spirit, his own first gift for those who believe, to complete his work in the world, and to bring to fulfillment the sanctification of all.

When the hour had come for him to be glorified by you, his heavenly Father, having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end; at supper with them he took bread, and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Father, we now celebrate this memorial of our redemption. Recalling Christ's death and his descent among the dead, proclaiming his resurrection and ascension to your right hand, awaiting his coming in glory; and offering to you, from the gifts you have given us, this bread and this cup, we praise you and we bless you.

*Celebrant and People*

**We praise you, we bless you,  
we give thanks to you,  
and we pray to you, Lord our God.**

Lord, we pray that in your goodness and mercy your Holy Spirit may descend upon us, and upon these gifts, sanctifying them and showing them to be holy gifts for your holy people, the bread of life and the cup of salvation, the Body and Blood of your Son Jesus Christ.

Grant that all who share this bread and cup may become one body and one spirit, a living sacrifice in Christ, to the praise of your Name.

Remember, Lord, your one holy catholic and apostolic Church, redeemed by the blood of your Christ. Reveal its unity, guard its faith, and preserve it in peace.

Remember Presiding Bishop Michael; our bishop Peter; Mother Leslie, Father Carl, Father Clark, and all who minister in your Church. Remember all your people of All Saints Episcopal Church and those who seek your truth. Remember all who have died in the peace of Christ, and those whose faith is known to you alone; bring them into the place of eternal joy and light.

And grant that we may find our inheritance with patriarchs, prophets, apostles, and martyrs, with the ever-blessed Virgin Mary, and all the saints who have found favor with you in ages past. We praise you in union with them and give you glory through your Son Jesus Christ our Lord.

Through Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, all honor and glory are yours, Almighty God and Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, for ever and for ever.
