A READING FROM EXODUS 3:1-15

Moses was keeping the flock of his father-in-law Jethro, the priest of Midian; he led his flock beyond the wilderness, and came to Horeb, the mountain of God. There the angel of the LORD appeared to him in a flame of fire out of a bush; he looked, and the bush was blazing, yet it was not consumed. Then Moses said, "I must turn aside and look at this great sight, and see why the bush is not burned up." When the LORD saw that he had turned aside to see, God called to him out of the bush, "Moses, Moses!" And he said, "Here I am." Then he said, "Come no closer! Remove the sandals from your feet, for the place on which you are standing is holy ground." He said further, "I am the God of your father, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob." And Moses hid his face, for he was afraid to look at God.

Then the LORD said, "I have observed the misery of my people who are in Egypt; I have heard their cry on account of their taskmasters. Indeed, I know their sufferings, and I have come down to deliver them from the Egyptians, and to bring them up out of that land to a good and broad land, a land flowing with milk and honey, to the country of the Canaanites, the Hittites, the Amorites, the Perizzites, the Hivites, and the Jebusites. THE SERMON

THE NICENE CREED

Intercessor Observe the misery of all who suffer from harsh taskmasters or from injustice or genocide. Hear their cries and come quickly to their rescue. We give you thanks, O God,
People **and call upon your name.**

Intercessor Guard us from being stumbling blocks to those among whom we live, and guide us to serve our neighbors humbly in the power of the cross. We give you thanks, O God,
People **and call upon your name.**

Intercessor Inspire our community to set our minds on divine things as we bring our concerns to you. Receive our prayers for those for whom we intercede, especially for all those on our All Saints prayer list, and for others we name, either silently or aloud.

(Pause for quiet reflection)

Hear our thanksgiving for all the blessings we enjoy, especially for those celebrating birthday and anniversaries this week, and for those we name either silently or aloud.

(Pause for quiet reflection)

Embrace in heaven those who have died, especially Gunnar Lindahl, father of Rosa Lindahl; for Jimmy Price, son of Barbara Price, on the anniversary of his birth; and for those we name, either silently or aloud.

(Pause for quiet reflection)

We give you thanks, O God,

People **and call upon your name.**

Celebrant We take up the cross of our intercession and service to you, O God, as we bring before you the suffering of the world: Let the power of Christ's resurrection bring your justice and glory into all creation, as we share our part in the redeeming work of Christ's cross, through the power of the Spirit, glorifying your Name in all the world. **Amen.**
