A READING FROM GENESIS 17:1-7, 15-16

When Abram was ninety-nine years old, the LORD appeared to Abram, and said to him, "I am God Almighty; walk before me, and be blameless. And I will make my covenant between me and you, and will make you exceedingly numerous." Then Abram fell on his face; and God said to him, "As for me, this is my covenant with you: You shall be the ancestor of a multitude of nations. No longer shall your name be Abram, but your name shall be Abraham; for I have made you the ancestor of a multitude of nations. I will make you exceedingly fruitful; and I will make nations of you, and kings shall come from you. A READING FROM ST. PAUL'S LETTER TO THE ROMANS 4:13-25

For the promise that he would inherit the world did not come to Abraham or to his descendants through the law but through the righteousness of faith. If it is the adherents of the law who are to be the heirs, faith is null and the promise is void. For the law brings wrath; but where there is no law, neither is there violation. For this reason it depends on faith, in order that the promise may rest on grace and be guaranteed to all his descendants, not only to the adherents of the law but also to those who share the faith of Abraham (for he is the father of all of us, as it is written, "I have made you the father of many nations") — in the presence of the God in whom he believed, who gives life to the dead and calls into existence the things that do not exist. Hoping against hope, he believed that he would become "the father of many nations," according to what was said, "So numerous shall your descendants be." He did not weaken in faith when he considered his own body, which was already as good as dead (for he was about a hundred years old), or when he considered the barrenness of Sarah's womb. No distrust made him waver concerning the promise of God, but he grew strong in his faith as he gave glory to God, being fully convinced that God was able to do what he had promised. Therefore his faith "was reckoned to him as righteousness." Now the words, "it was reckoned to him," were written not for his sake alone, but for ours also. It will be reckoned to us who believe in him who raised Jesus our Lord from the dead, who was handed over to death for our trespasses and was raised for our justification.

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Laundry Love South Florida

We are excited to share that we resurrected Laundry Love South Florida in late November, but in a different way. Due to COVID, we had to stop our monthly volunteer events last March. Through our partnership with The Laundromart, 1410 N. Federal Highway, Hollywood, FL; we were able to work out a process where their attendants now temporarily assist our guests until we can resume again with our volunteer team in person.

The great news is that since we first started in October, 2019, that as of January 31, 2021, over 363 guests have washed 1502 loads, which equals over 15 tons of clean laundry! We will shortly have numbers for the month of February and we will then resume our monthly reports to everyone.

A special thanks to each of you who have pitched in to make Laundry Love South Florida a success. We invite members of the South Florida community to support Laundry Love in one or more of the following ways:

- If you are interested, we also collect supplies such as pods, bottled or powdered detergents and fabric softener sheets. These items can be dropped off at All Saints when we have an outdoor Sunday church event or by contacting the office to check on a time to stop by.

About Laundry Love South Florida

Laundry Love South Florida is a ministry of All Saints Episcopal Church in Fort Lauderdale, FL, which assists homeless and low-income individuals in washing their clothing and bedding for free. Based on recent national statistics, individuals who do not have laundry appliances can spend between \$56 – \$84 per month on washing clothing and bedding. Additionally, unsanitary or dirty clothing and bedding can have adverse effects on children in school as well as lead to health and mental wellness issues in adults.
