
Guidelines and Procedures

In-Person Worship

The CDC has issued guidance that all people, regardless of vaccination status, should wear masks in gathering in areas of high transmission. Intercessor The earth is yours and all that is in it, Immortal One: Let your power go forth throughout the earth to make all things new, guiding the rulers and authorities in this world. You will dwell with us as our God,
People **and we will be your people.**

Intercessor Your Glory, O God, is revealed from the hills to the sea: Grant us faith to see your glory in all of creation that we might honor you as we care for the world you have made. You will dwell with us as our God,
People **and we will be your people.**

Intercessor Your home, O God, is among mortals, and you watch over your elect: Look upon all who suffer throughout the world, and wipe away every tear from their eyes. You will dwell with us as our God,
People **and we will be your people.**

Intercessor We pray to you, O Gracious One, on behalf of all for whom we intercede, especially those on our All Saints prayer list, and those we name either silently or aloud. *(Pause for quiet reflections)*

We lift up our heads to thank you, O God, for all your blessings and grace, especially those celebrating birthdays or anniversaries this week, and those we name either silently or aloud. *(Pause for quiet reflections)*

Hold the departed in your hand, O God, where they will be at peace, especially those we name either silently or aloud. *(Pause for quiet reflections)*

You will dwell with us as our God,
People **and we will be your people.**

Celebrant O God of resurrection, take away the stones that entomb us and darken our lives, and fill us with the power and peace of your eternal life, that we may see your glory and live in your light, through Jesus Christ the Risen One, who meets us in the power of the Holy Spirit and who lives with you as One God, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

CONFESSION OF SIN

Officiant Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor.

Silence may be kept. The congregation may stand or kneel.

Minister and People

Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your Name. Amen.

Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you all your sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life. **Amen.**
