You raised your Son as the firstborn of the dead: Bring all humanity into your divine life, and welcome those who come to you, especially those we name either silently or aloud. *(Pause for quiet reflection)* To Christ who loves us and freed us;

People **to Christ be glory and dominion forever.**

Celebrant Almighty and transcendent God, your glory fills all creation and your authority extends beyond time and forever: Let your Spirit open our lives to your grace and truth, that we may always see your Christ at his coming, to whom be glory and dominion forever and ever. **Amen.**

The Education for Ministry program will resume at All Saints after a one year hiatus. Operating under the auspices of The University of the South (Sewanee), EfM invites people into small groups that help us understand our lives and shape our actions as we examine and deepen our Christian faith. Through study, prayer and theological reflection EfM enables each of us to discover and exercise our own God-given gifts for ministry in everyday life. It is not preparation for the priesthood.

An EfM seminar with six to 12 students and a trained mentor meets weekly for three hours over the course of a nine-month academic year. The All Saints group meets on Monday evenings from 6:30 PM to 9:30 PM. **A new class will begin on January 10, 2022. The seminar will meet in person at the Parish House on the All Saints campus.** All necessary health and safety precautions will be addressed. While the full curriculum takes four years to complete participants are asked to commit to only one year at a time. Upon completion participants will receive a diploma from The University of the South. There is a tuition fee and some financial aid may be available.


