A READING FROM THE ACTS OF THE APOSTLES 11:1-18

Now the apostles and the believers who were in Judea heard that the Gentiles had also accepted the word of God. So when Peter went up to Jerusalem, the circumcised believers criticized him, saying, "Why did you go to uncircumcised men and eat with them?" Then Peter began to explain it to them, step by step, saying, "I was in the city of Joppa praying, and in a trance I saw a vision. There was something like a large sheet coming down from heaven, being lowered by its four corners; and it came close to me. As I looked at it closely I saw four-footed animals, beasts of prey, reptiles, and birds of the air. I also heard a voice saying to me, 'Get up, Peter; kill and eat.' But I replied, 'By no means, Lord; for nothing profane or unclean has ever entered my mouth.' But a second time the voice answered from heaven, 'What God has made clean, you must not call profane.' This happened three times; then everything was pulled up again to heaven. At that very moment three men, sent to me from Caesarea, arrived at the house where we were. The Spirit told me to go with them and not to make a distinction between them and us. These six brothers also accompanied me, and we entered the man's house. He told us how he had seen the angel standing in his house and saying, 'Send to Joppa and bring Simon, who is called Peter; he will give you a message by which you and your entire household will be saved.' And as I began to speak, the Holy Spirit fell upon them just as it had upon us at the beginning. And I remembered the word of the Lord, how he had said, 'John baptized with water,

but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.' If then God gave them the same gift that he gave us when we believed in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I that I could hinder God?" When they heard this, they were silenced. And they praised God, saying, "Then God has given even to the Gentiles the repentance that leads to life."

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WELCOME TO MOTHER ROBYN NEVILLE

We are pleased and honored to welcome the Rev. Dr. Robyn Neville to All Saints this morning to celebrate and preach at our services today.

A priest in the Episcopal Church since her ordination in 2003, the Rev. Dr. Robyn M. Neville, Ph.D., currently serves as a chaplain and theological educator in the Diocese of Southeast Florida. She has held positions as a Visiting Professor of Ecclesiastical History at General Theological Seminary, as a Visiting Instructor of Church History at Candler School of Theology and Emory University, and as an Adjunct Professor of Church History at the Sewanee School of Theology at the University of the South. After earning a BA with honors in religion at the College of William and Mary in Virginia, Robyn studied at Virginia Theological Seminary, where she earned the MDiv with honors in church history, and Harvard Divinity School, where she obtained the ThM with special research concentrations in medieval Irish studies, medieval Christian spirituality, and psychoanalytic theory. Her doctoral research work at Emory University has focused on medieval Irish church history and gender, and she has won several research awards, including a grant from the National Endowment for the Humanities to study medieval Jewish-Christian relations at Oxford University in England. Robyn has served as the elected President of the Historical Society of the Episcopal Church since 2016, and she has been a board member of the Historical Society since 2012 (and chair of the Grants Committee from 2013-2016). As President, Robyn works with an editorial board to produce the quarterly academic journal, *Anglican and Episcopal History*. She has recently been appointed as the Academic Dean and Director of the Center for Christian Formation and Leadership, the diocesan school of theology of the Diocese of Southeast Florida. Alongside leading scholars in the fields of church history, liturgy, and Celtic studies, Robyn has two articles on the Eucharist in medieval Irish narrative in the anthology, *Treasures of Irish Christianity: People and Places, Images and Texts* (Veritas, 2012). Her chapter on the history and development of the Anglican Church of Ireland is included in *The Wiley-Blackwell Companion to the Anglican Communion* (Wiley, 2013), a definitive guide to Anglican history, identity and legacy.
