A READING FROM THE ACTS OF THE APOSTLES 2:1-21

When the day of Pentecost had come, the disciples were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? You formed us in your own image, giving the whole world into our care, so that, in obedience to you, our Creator, we might rule and serve all your creatures. When our disobedience took us far from you, you did not abandon us to the power of death. In your mercy you came to our help, so that in seeking you we might find you. Again and again you called us into covenant with you, and through the prophets you taught us to hope for salvation.

Father, you loved the world so much that in the fullness of time you sent your only Son to be our Savior. Incarnate by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, he lived as one of us, yet without sin. To the poor he proclaimed the good news of salvation; to prisoners, freedom; to the sorrowful, joy. To fulfill your purpose he gave himself up to death; and, rising from the grave, destroyed death, and made the whole creation new.

And, that we might live no longer for ourselves, but for him who died and rose for us, he sent the Holy Spirit, his own first gift for those who believe, to complete his work in the world, and to bring to fulfillment the sanctification of all.

When the hour had come for him to be glorified by you, his heavenly Father, having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end; at supper with them he took bread, and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Father, we now celebrate this memorial of our redemption. Recalling Christ's death and his descent among the dead, proclaiming his resurrection and ascension to your right hand, awaiting his coming in glory; and offering to you, from the gifts you have given us, this bread and this cup, we praise you and we bless you.

RECTOR'S DISCRETIONARY FUND

The book of Acts and the letters of Paul tell us that from the very earliest days of the church, it was directed that alms should be donated that can be distributed by those tasked with pastoral care to help the poor and others who are dispossessed. In the Episcopal Church, tradition and our church canons call for every parish to set aside a discretionary fund for the rector and/or other clergy to be given out at the rector's discretion to help those in need in immediate ways. People are sometimes from the wider community, but they may also be members of the parish. These funds are usually paid directly towards the bills most needed. The disbursements of the Rector's Discretionary Fund are confidential, especially in the case of parish members.

Episcopal Church canons state that the preferred way of funding the Rector's Discretionary Fund is by dedicating the loose plate offering of the first Sunday of the month to the Rector's Discretionary Fund. Beginning today, our loose plate offering (all offerings not dedicated for a particular purpose, such as fulfillment of a pledge) on the first Sunday of the month will be placed in Mother Leslie's Discretionary Fund so that she may help others on behalf of all of us. You may also make a donation anytime by marking "Rector's Discretionary Fund" on the memo of a check, on an offering envelope in the pews, or by choosing "Rector's Discretionary Fund" on our online donation page.
