#### A READING FROM THE BOOK OF ACTS 10:34-43

Peter began to speak to Cornelius and the other Gentiles: "I truly understand that God shows no partiality, but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ--he is Lord of all. That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. ### THANKSGIVING OVER THE WATER

Celebrant The Lord be with you.

People And also with you.

Celebrant Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People It is right to give God thanks and praise.

Celebrant We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life. We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Now sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those here are cleansed from sin and born again and may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior. To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and forever. **Amen.** 

#### THE BAPTISM

The candidate is presented by name to the Celebrant, who then pours water upon, the candidate, saying:

Cat, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. *People loudly* **Amen.** 

Celebrant Let us pray.

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon this your servant, the forgiveness of sin, and have raised her to the new life of grace. Sustain her, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give her an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. **Amen.** 

Then the Priest places a hand on the person's head, marking on the forehead the sign of the cross and saying

Cat, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever. *People loudly* **Amen.** 

*Celebrant* Let us welcome the newly baptized.

# Follow Mother Leslie's Pilgrimage!

When I was a seminarian in the mid-1990's, my mother gifted me a small figurine depicting the Church of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem.

According to traditions dating back to the 4th century, it contains two sites considered holy in Christianity: the site where Jesus was crucified at a place known as Calvary or Golgotha, and Jesus's empty tomb, which is where he was buried and resurrected. I have never been to Holy Sepulchre, but I have always been fond of this little statue.

It caught my eye tonight, and I was struck with a sense of awe that next

week I will head to Jerusalem and finally visit this holiest site in Christendom. I will see it from every angle and pray at the site of the crucifixion and rejoice at the empty tomb. While I am there, I am going to look for the best angle to photograph as I see it in my little reproduction.

During my pilgrimage, I will be sharing with you all pictures I've captured as I walk this Holy Land. I will often add short reflections on what we are doing and how the Spirit speaks to me each day. We continue to experience a steady increase in the number of families who come to Laundry Love! Many of our guests are now washing clothing or bedding for their families. Why is this significant for families who are in need?

- Lack of accessible laundry equipment due to their living conditions and/or lack of money to buy detergent and/or pay for laundromat facilities causes poor and homeless families and individuals to have difficulty in cleaning their clothing and bedding.
- Sociologists and teachers tell us that homeless or low-income children often miss school and suffer socially and academically because they do not have clean clothes (body odor issues).

What is most important about Laundry Love, though, is what clean laundry means to each guest. Someone struggling in a minimum wage job <a href="https://linear.com/has/">has/</a> clean uniforms. Children go to school without being teased or bullied due to having dirty or smelly clothes. Families have the comfort of clean clothes or blankets.
