On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

MANY THANKS FROM THE OUTREACH COMMITTEE!

The Outreach Committee is so grateful to all the loving hands that put together the Streetlight Packets for the homeless. Thanks to Cynthia and Jon Floria we had a full supply of snacks to pack into out packets and we made close to 160 of them!!!! They were blessed by Mother Leslie and are ready to send out into the community. They are for sale in the Narthex, the money goes to replenishing our supply to make new packets.

On another front , David Pearce has spearheaded the purchase of over 1000 brand-new Spanish language books for the after-school program in Guatemala that we support. The books were purchased with outreach funds and will be shipped to the school for use in the after-school program and the local primary school. Our next goal for the school is to purchase an additional 1600 books and ship them as soon as we can fund the purchase. We are working on scheduling our next Peanut butter and jam event so stay tuned.



Did you know that even given our substantial endowment funds, the largest percentage of our operating income each year is your pledges and plate donations?

Thank you to those who made a Rooted in Abundance pledge for 2024. If you have not yet made a pledge, there is still time. Please return your Rooted in Abundance card or otherwise let the office know the gift you intend for 2024. Electronic version of the pledge card is on our website. We also have pledge cards in the Narthex if you need one.

Through this week, we have 113 pledges totaling \$359,754 compared to our hoped-for total of \$440,000 (10% more than 2023 planned pledges). We must finalize our budget for the year, and without these resources we will be significantly constrained in our plans for all of our ministries. Our physical facilities are partially supported through targeted endowment funds, but we rely on parishioner gifts for staff and program expenses. Please prayerfully consider your presence and financial participation in All Saints. Together we are Rooted in Abundance!

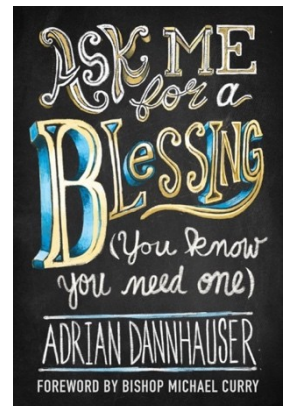
