A READING FROM THE 1st LETTER OF PAUL TO THE CORINTHIANS 9:16-23.

If I proclaim the gospel, this gives me no ground for boasting, for an obligation is laid on me, and woe to me if I do not proclaim the gospel! For if I do this of my own will, I have a reward; but if not of my own will, I am entrusted with a commission. What then is my reward? Just this: that in my proclamation I may make the gospel free of charge, so as not to make full use of my rights in the gospel.

For though I am free with respect to all, I have made myself a slave to all, so that I might win more of them. To the Jews I became as a Jew, in order to win Jews. TRAFFIC STOP LIGHT PACKETS

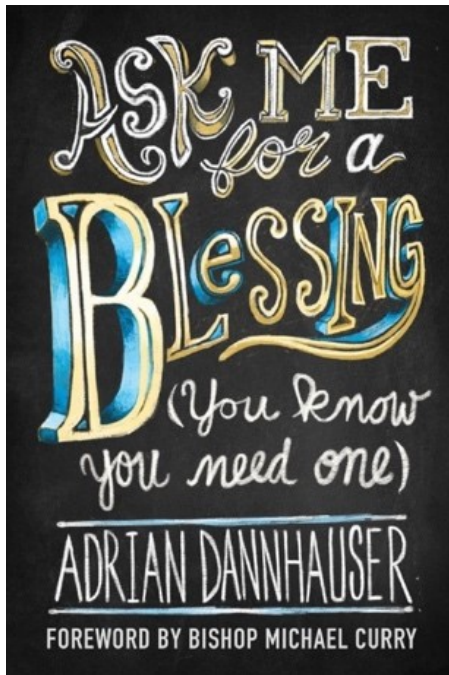
ARE RESTOCKED AND AVAILABLE IN THE NARTHEX.

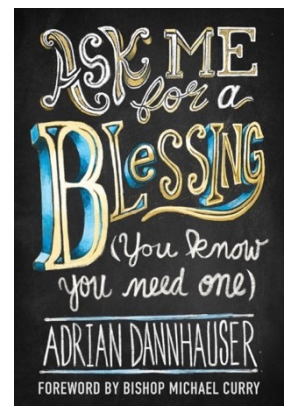
