Vanity of vanities, says the Teacher, vanity of vanities! All is vanity.  
I, the Teacher, when king over Israel in Jerusalem, applied my mind to seek and to search out by wisdom all that is done under heaven; it is an unhappy business that God has given to human beings to be busy with. I saw all the deeds that are done under the sun; and see, all is vanity and a chasing after wind.

## **A READING FROM PAUL'S LETTER TO THE COLOSSIANS 3:1-11**

If you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth, for you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ who is your life is revealed, then you also will be revealed with him in glory.

Put to death, therefore, whatever in you is earthly: fornication, impurity, passion, evil desire, and greed (which is idolatry). On account of these the wrath of God is coming on those who are disobedient. These are the ways you also once followed, when you were living that life. But now you must get rid of all such things-- anger, wrath, malice, slander, and abusive language from your mouth. Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have stripped off the old self with its practices and have clothed yourselves with the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge according to the image of its creator. In that renewal there is no longer Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave and free; but Christ is all and in all!

## **THANKSGIVING OVER THE WATER**

*Presider* Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

*Presider* We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Now sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again and may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior. To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and forever. **Amen.**

## **THE BAPTISM**

Christopher, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

*Then the Priest places a hand on each person's head, marking on the forehead the sign of the cross and saying*  
Christopher, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever.

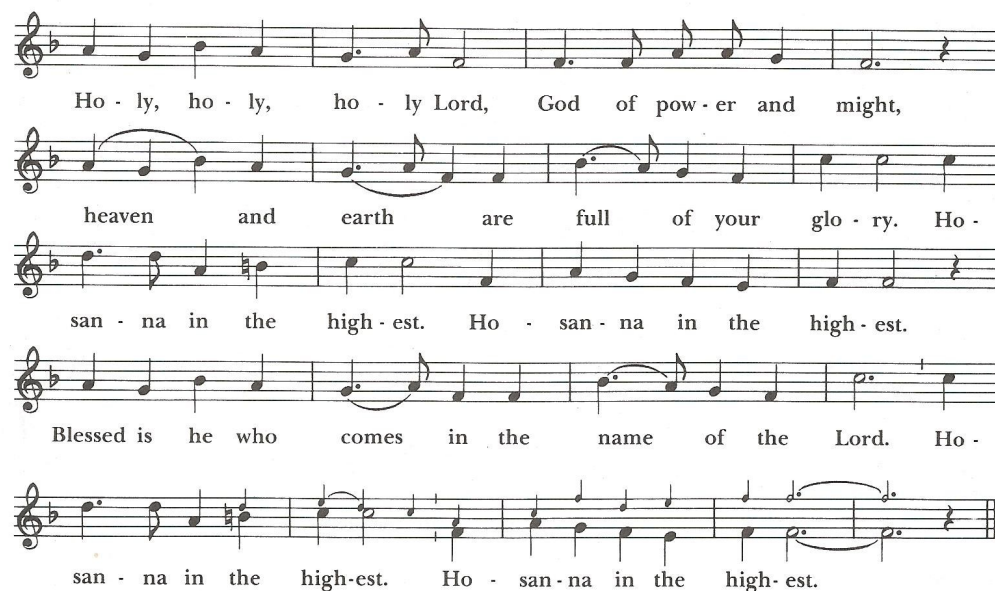

## TROPICAL STORMS AND HURRICANES

### INCLEMENT WEATHER ALERT

Remember, about three days out the National Hurricane Center will give fairly accurate predictions concerning the landfall of a Tropical Storm or Hurricane. Please pay attention to the tropical weather reports and adjust your life accordingly. This is a good time for everyone to check their 'storm supplies' and go over their evacuation plan. In the event of a **Tropical Storm or a Hurricane Warning the church office will be closed and all services cancelled**. When possible (e.g., power and internet are available) the web site will be updated with the current status and provide any further information.
