Laundry Love in Hollywood

We had a busy day when we met at The Laundry Spot Hollywood, 1410 N Federal Highway, Hollywood, FL 33020, on Tuesday, September 9, 2025.



Our 7 volunteers helped 34 guests as we provided funds, detergents and softeners for the laundry machines. This assistance enabled our guests to wash and dry 171 loads of dirty clothing and bedding, a total of over 3,400 lbs., or approximately 1 1/2 tons of now clean laundry! Our hungry guests also enjoyed lots of pizza and bottled water on this warm and very wet day.

We also recognize each of you who help us in any way that you can, as we cannot provide this awesome service without you! Everyone who supports Laundry Love South Florida, whether by cash contributions, miscellaneous donations or by volunteering at our events, end up helping so many individuals, families and children who are in tremendous need of nice clean clothes.

SEARCH TEAM UPDATE

ASEC's Rector position was posted at the beginning of July, with a deadline of early September for interested clergy to submit applications. This is, therefore, a relatively quiet time for the Search Team as we await the list of candidates approved for our consideration.

We know that we are receiving applications, but we have no insight into the number or names of applicants. It is a bit frustrating to wait, but that is the procedure in our diocese! Once the posting deadline is reached, Bishop Eaton and Canon Montgomery will review the applicants and present the qualified candidate applications to the Committee. Then we hope to be back into a very active period!

MORE BOOKS GOING TO GUATEMALA!



Our deepest thanks to Deacon Phyllis Manoogian for her visit this past Sunday. Deacon Phyllis runs the Niños Creadores de Historia school in Antigua, Guatemala, and works tirelessly to help the young people there to set good learning habits, which drastically improves their odds for a successful life.

We are excited to share that we are packing our **tenth** care box filled with school supplies and Spanish-language children's books! We plan to have it ready for pickup by our shipper within the week.

These boxes provide *Niños Creadores de Historia School* (Children Creators of History) with essential learning tools—writing paper, crayons, pencils, and other basics that help first- and second-grade students who are struggling in school.

A major part of this outreach program is to supply not only *Niños Creadores de Historia School* with books, but also the neighborhood public school, and to give students their very own books to start personal libraries at home. In Guatemala, public schools rarely provide textbooks. Instead, parents are expected to purchase them, but many simply do not have the financial means to buy any school supplies. Sadly, children cannot learn to read if they have nothing to read.

With this shipment, our total number of books delivered to Guatemalan children will surpass **4,000 books**. That's 4,000 chances for a child to discover the joy of reading, improve literacy skills, and open doors to a brighter future.
