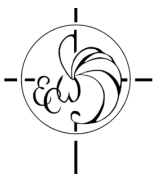

This assistance enabled our guests to wash and dry 144 loads of dirty clothing and bedding, a total of over 2,800 lbs., or approximately 1 1/4 tons of now clean laundry! Our hungry guests enjoyed lots of pizza and bottled water, and we celebrated our anniversary with festive holiday themed cupcakes. We also provided over 10 bags of donated clothing and socks which helped replace some of their currently worn clothing.
