## **A READING FROM PAUL’S LETTER TO THE ROMANS 4:1-5, 13-17**

What then are we to say was gained by Abraham, our ancestor according to the flesh? For if Abraham was justified by works, he has something to boast about, but not before God. For what does the scripture say? “Abraham believed God, and it was reckoned to him as righteousness.” Now to one who works, wages are not reckoned as a gift but as something due. But to one who without works trusts him who justifies the ungodly, such faith is reckoned as righteousness.

For the promise that he would inherit the world did not come to Abraham or to his descendants through the law but through the righteousness of faith. If it is the adherents of the law who are to be the heirs, faith is null and the promise is void. For the law brings wrath; but where there is no law, neither is there violation.

For this reason it depends on faith, in order that the promise may rest on grace and be guaranteed to all his descendants, not only to the adherents of the law but also to those who share the faith of Abraham (for he is the father of all of us, as it is written, “I have made you the father of many nations”) —in the presence of the God in whom he believed, who gives life to the dead and calls into existence the things that do not exist.

There was a Pharisee named Nicodemus, a leader of the Jews. He came to Jesus by night and said to him, “Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God; for no one can do these signs that you do apart from the presence of God.” Jesus answered him, “Very truly, I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God without being born from above.” Nicodemus said to him, “How can anyone be born after having grown old? Can one enter a second time into the mother’s womb and be born?” Jesus answered, “Very truly, I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit. What is born of the flesh is flesh, and what is born of the Spirit is spirit. Do not be astonished that I said to you, ‘You must be born from above.’ The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit.” Nicodemus said to him, “How can these things be?” Jesus answered him, “Are you a teacher of Israel, and yet you do not understand these things?

“Very truly, I tell you, we speak of what we know and testify to what we have seen; yet you do not receive our testimony. If I have told you about earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you about heavenly things? No one has ascended

into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life.


Therefore, according to his command, O Father,



Rich Markiewicz, certified as an Advanced Grief Recovery Method Specialist® with advanced training on grief and loss through the Grief Recovery Institute®, will be offering an eight week in-person Grief Recovery Method Workshop at All Saints beginning Saturday, March 7, 2026, and ending May 2, 2026. There will be no workshop held the day before Easter, Saturday, April 4, 2026.

Rich shares that, “Grief is the normal and natural reaction to change or loss of any kind. Many times, we express it by saying that we are stressed, we feel burned out or depressed. No matter what we call it, it is still grief. Death and divorce are the most obvious types of loss but over 40 types of loss have been identified that produce grief. These include loss of health, loss of a job or career, moving, starting school, marriage, graduation, end of addictions, financial challenges, retirement, legal problems and others. Children also endure various types of loss, and I am thrilled to help parents, caretakers and educators discover how to help them.”

**GUATEMALA MISSION TRIP ANNOUNCEMENT APRIL 25 – MAY 2, 2026**  
**(WITH OPTIONAL 3-DAY EXTENSION TO TIKAL NATIONAL PARK)**

All Saints Episcopal Church will offer a mission trip to Guatemala focused on education, relationship, and cultural engagement from April 25 through May 2, 2026.

Six years ago, All Saints sent a mission group to Guatemala to support a small school serving at-risk children. That trip proved to be deeply meaningful and transformative for everyone involved. Just as importantly, it marked the beginning of an ongoing relationship that continues to this day.

The mission portion of the trip will center on our partnership with Niños Creadores de Historia School, located in the community of San Andrés Itzapa, near the historic and beautiful city of Antigua. The school provides supplemental educational support to first- and second-grade students who are most at risk of falling behind or dropping out of school. Trip participants may assist with activities such as reading with children, supporting teachers in the classroom, organizing learning materials, or helping with light facility projects. No special skills are required - only a willingness to listen, learn, and engage with a cheerful spirit. The trip is rooted in Christian service and reflection. Daily group reflection and shared conversation will be woven into the week as we seek to grow spiritually and better understand our call to serve alongside others. Participants will stay in Antigua, approximately a 45-minute drive from the school, allowing time to experience Guatemalan culture, history, and daily life. For those who wish, an optional post-trip extension to explore the famous Mayan ruins at Tikal National Park, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, will be available.
