

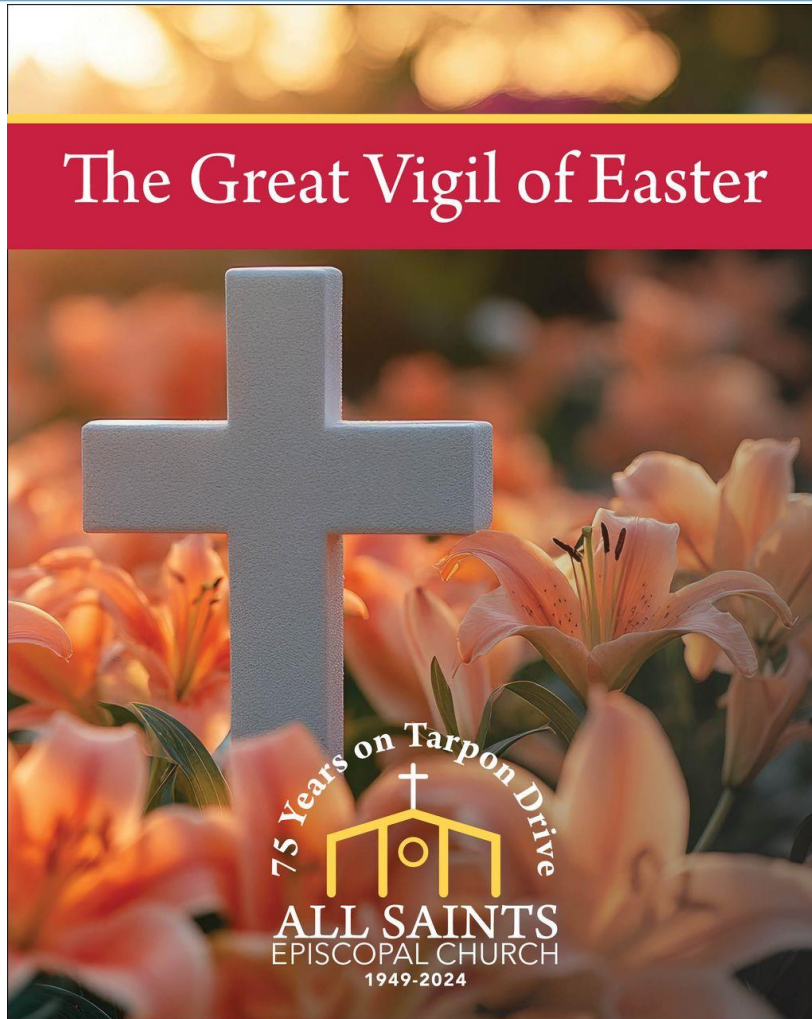

## THE GREAT VIGIL OF EASTER

### HOLY EUCHARIST RITE II

APRIL 4, 2026 7:00 PM

**THE RIGHT REVEREND GREG RICKEL IS THE PRESIDERS AND PREACHER THIS EVENING.**

*As we are using **REAL CANDLES** tonight, please make sure the drip guard is on the candle and please try your best not to drip candle wax on the pews, cushions, floor, etc. Some of it cannot be helped, but you will help us with clean up later if you give this some attention! Thank you!!!!*

*Before the liturgy begins, while the church is still, and in consideration of those around you, please maintain silence and refrain from all mobile phone use as much as possible.*

*In the darkness, fire is kindled; after which the Presider addresses the people.*

Dear friends in Christ: On this most holy night, in which our Lord Jesus passed over from death to life, the Church invites her members, dispersed throughout the world, to gather in vigil and prayer. For this is the Passover of the Lord, in which, by hearing his Word and celebrating his Sacraments, we share in his victory over death.

*The Bishop censes the New Fire.*

*Presider* Let us pray.

O God, through your Son you have bestowed upon your people the brightness of your light: Sanctify this new fire, and grant that in this Paschal feast we may so burn with heavenly desires, that with pure minds we may attain to the festival of everlasting light; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

*The Bishop prepares the Paschal Candle by tracing a cross and piercing it with nails. The Paschal Candle is then lit from the newly-kindled fire, and the clergy carries the candle through the Assembly. As the candle stops each time, people are asked to light their candles from the Paschal Candle and to share with those around them. The procession pauses three times to elevate the candle and sing:*

*Presider* The light of Christ.

*People* **Thanks be to God.**

*The Paschal Candle is placed in its stand. The Bishop censes the Candle.*

*The Cantor, standing near the Candle, sings the Exsultet:*

Rejoice now, heavenly hosts and choirs of angels, and let your trumpets shout Salvation for the victory of our mighty King.

Rejoice and sing now, all the round earth, bright with a glorious splendor, for darkness has been vanquished by our eternal King.

Rejoice and be glad now, Mother Church, and let your holy courts, in radiant light, resound with the praises of your people.

All you who stand near this marvelous and holy flame, pray with me to God the Almighty for the grace to sing the worthy praise of this great light; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

*Cantor*      The Lord be with you.

*People*      **And also with you.**

*Cantor*      Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

*People*      **It is right to give God thanks and praise.**

It is truly right and good, always and everywhere, with our whole heart and mind and voice, to praise you, the invisible, almighty, and eternal God, and your only-begotten Son, Jesus Christ our Lord; for he is the true Paschal Lamb, who at the feast of the Passover paid for us the debt of Adam's sin, and by his blood delivered your faithful people.

This is the night, when you brought our fathers, the children of Israel, out of bondage in Egypt, and led them through the Red Sea on dry land. This is the night, when all who believe in Christ are delivered from the gloom of sin, and are restored to grace and holiness of life. This is the night, when Christ broke the bonds of death and hell, and rose victorious from the grave. How wonderful and beyond our knowing, O God, is your mercy and loving-kindness to us, that to redeem a slave, you gave a Son.

How holy is this night, when wickedness is put to flight, and sin is washed away. It restores innocence to the fallen, and joy to those who mourn. It casts out pride and hatred, and brings peace and concord. How blessed is this night, when earth and heaven are joined and we are reconciled to God.

Holy Father, accept our evening sacrifice, the offering of this candle in your honor. May it shine continually to drive away all darkness. May Christ, the Morning Star who knows no setting, find it ever burning--he who gives his light to all creation, and who lives and reigns for ever and ever. **Amen.**

### THE SACRAMENTAL RITES OF HOLY BAPTISM AND INITIATION

#### THE RENEWAL OF BAPTISMAL VOWS

*The Bishop invites all to renew the vows made (or made on their behalf) at their Baptism.*

*Bishop* Do you believe in God the Father?  
*People* **I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.**  
*Bishop* Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?  
*People* **I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.  
He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the  
Virgin Mary.  
He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was  
buried.  
He descended to the dead.  
On the third day he rose again.  
He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the  
Father.  
He will come again to judge the living and the dead.**

*Bishop* Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?  
*People* **I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church,  
the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins,  
the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.**

*Bishop* Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the  
breaking of bread, and in the prayers?  
*People* **I will, with God's help.**

*Bishop* Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin,  
repent and return to the Lord?  
*People* **I will, with God's help.**

*Bishop* Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in  
Christ?  
*People* **I will, with God's help.**

*Bishop* Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as  
yourself?  
*People* **I will, with God's help.**

*Bishop* Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect  
the dignity of every human being?  
*People* **I will, with God's help.**

*Bishop* Let us now pray for these persons who are to receive the Sacrament  
of New Birth and for those renewing their commitment to Christ.

*The prayer will be chanted by the Cantor*



*The candidates, sponsors, and ministers process back to the baptismal font, located at the entrance to the nave. Everyone is invited to leave their seats and gather around the font in order to have a better view of the Baptism or feel free to stay in your pew.*

*The Bishop censes the Font.*

### THE THANKSGIVING OVER THE WATER

*Bishop*  *Assembly*  
 The Lord be with you. And al - so with you.

*Bishop*   
 Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

*Assembly*   
 It is right to give God thanks and praise.

*Presider* We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Now sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior. To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever. **Amen.**

### **THE BAPTISMS**

*The candidates are baptized in the Name of the Trinity. The Assembly responds: **Amen.***

*Then is sealed with chrism, oil blessed by the Bishop during Holy Week for use at Baptism. The Assembly responds: **Amen.***

*Candles lit from the Paschal Candle are given to the newly baptized, as a symbol of our Baptismal Ministry to carry the light of Christ into the world. When these actions have been completed for all candidates, the Bishop prays over the newly baptized.*

*The Assembly responds: **Amen.***

### **WELCOME**

*Bishop* Let us welcome the newly baptized.

**All** **We receive you into the household of God.**  
**Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection,**  
**and share with us in his eternal priesthood.**

### **BAPTISMAL SPRINKLING**

*The Assembly is sprinkled with baptismal water as a sign and reminder of our Baptism.*

### **RECEPTIONS**

*Each candidate has hands laid on them as they are received into the Episcopal Church by the Bishop.*

*The Bishop then says a concluding prayer.*

*All return to their seats as the altar party and candidates process back to the altar.*

### **THE PROCLAMATION OF EASTER**

*The Bishop shall say to the people, and repeat 3 times*

*Bishop* Alleluia! Christ is risen!

*People* **The Lord is risen indeed! Alleluia!**

*The Church is illuminated. All extinguish their candles.*

*All ring bells throughout the singing of the following Canticle, Gloria in excelsis.*

**GLORY TO GOD Gloria in excelsis S-278**

**Glory to God in the highest, and peace to his people on earth.**

**Lord God, heavenly King, almighty God and Father,**

**we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory.**

**Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father,**

**Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world:**

**have mercy on us;**

**you are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer.**

**For you alone are the Holy One,**

**you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High,**

**Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit,**

**in the glory of God the Father. Amen.**

#### **THE COLLECT**

*Presider* The Lord be with you.

*People* **And also with you.**

*Presider* Let us pray. *(Silence)*

O God, who made this most holy night to shine with the glory of the Lord's resurrection: Stir up in your Church that Spirit of adoption which is given to us in Baptism, that we, being renewed both in body and mind, may worship you in sincerity and truth; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

#### **A READING FROM THE LETTER OF PAUL TO THE ROMANS 6:3-11**

Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? Therefore we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life. For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. We know that our old self was crucified with him so that the body of sin might be destroyed, and we might no longer be enslaved to sin. For whoever has died is freed from sin. But if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. The death he died, he died to sin, once for

all; but the life he lives, he lives to God. So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

*Gospeler* The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew 28:1-10

*People* **Glory to you, Lord Christ.**

After the sabbath, as the first day of the week was dawning, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to see the tomb. And suddenly there was a great earthquake; for an angel of the Lord, descending from heaven, came and rolled back the stone and sat on it. His appearance was like lightning, and his clothing white as snow. For fear of him the guards shook and became like dead men. But the angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid; I know that you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. He is not here; for he has been raised, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay. Then go quickly and tell his disciples, 'He has been raised from the dead, and indeed he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him.' This is my message for you." So they left the tomb quickly with fear and great joy, and ran to tell his disciples. Suddenly Jesus met them and said, "Greetings!" And they came to him, took hold of his feet, and worshiped him. Then Jesus said to them, "Do not be afraid; go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee; there they will see me."

We acclaim you, holy Lord, glorious in power. Your mighty works reveal your wisdom and love. You formed us in your own image, giving the whole world into our care, so that, in obedience to you, our Creator, we might rule and serve all your creatures. When our disobedience took us far from you, you did not abandon us to the power of death. In your mercy you came to our help, so that in seeking you we might find you. Again and again you called us into covenant with you, and through the prophets you taught us to hope for salvation.

Father, you loved the world so much that in the fullness of time you sent your only Son to be our Savior. Incarnate by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, he lived as one of us, yet without sin. To the poor he proclaimed the good news of salvation; to prisoners, freedom; to the sorrowful, joy. To fulfill your purpose he gave himself up to death; and, rising from the grave, destroyed death, and made the whole creation new.

And, that we might live no longer for ourselves, but for him who died and rose for us, he sent the Holy Spirit, his own first gift for those who believe, to complete his work in the world, and to bring to fulfillment the sanctification of all.

When the hour had come for him to be glorified by you, his heavenly Father, having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end; at supper with them he took bread, and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Father, we now celebrate this memorial of our redemption. Recalling Christ's death and his descent among the dead, proclaiming his resurrection and ascension to your right hand, awaiting his coming in glory; and offering to you, from the gifts you have given us, this bread and this cup, we praise you and we bless you.

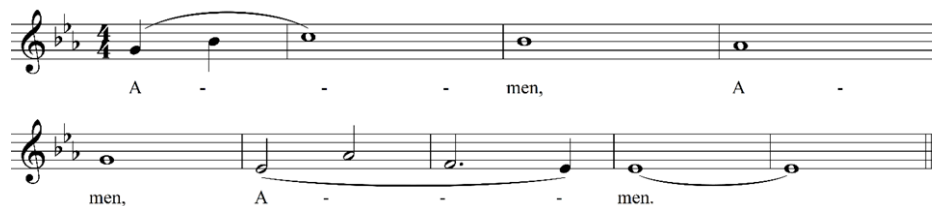
