But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. While he was going and they were gazing up toward heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. They said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up toward heaven? Eight members and friends of All Saints Episcopal Church in Fort Lauderdale traveled to Guatemala City on Saturday, April 25 for a seven-day mission trip to Niños Creadores de Historia School in San Andrés Itzapa. The travel party included trip leader David Pearce, Father Carl Beasley, Floyd Taylor, Joan Meznar, Ken Gouwens, Andrew Cuthbertson, Bob Carpenter, and Julie Kurtz. The hotel Convento Santa Catalina in Antigua was the base of operations and provided breakfast and some of the dinners for the travel party.

Deacon Phyllis Manoogian, director of the school, arranged for the trip and led the mission party. Her school accommodates first and second graders to prepare them for further education and life in general.

As part of the trip, the missionaries painted the school walls and worked with the children on their reading and other elementary skills. A highlight of the week was the final party at a nearby park. Games, prizes, and pizza were a big hit. Fun was had by both staff and students.



Time was also available to the missionaries for sightseeing in Antigua, Guatemala City, and a visitation to several Mayan ruins. Several folks stayed an additional three days for a flight and sightseeing excursion to the Mayan ruins in Tikal.

The trip was colorful, enlightening, sometimes tiring, but infinitely rewarding. All gained the satisfaction of serving for at least one week as Christ's arms and legs to aid young children in their journey for a more enriching life.

**PENTECOST SUNDAY – MAY 24, 2026
