Today is the day to join Jon and Cynthia Floria in **Neaverson Chapel** after the **10:30am Coffee Hour** to help the team pack nutritious snack packs that are provided to the homeless men and women who panhandle at the crossroads in Broward County. 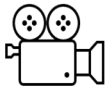

In 2009, Dan and Jim retired and moved to Fort Lauderdale, FL, where Dan was a member of All Saints Episcopal Church and served the Church as Junior Warden of the Vestry, as a member of the Alter Guild, and as an Ecumenical Minister.

As a member of All Saints Episcopal Church and later St. Anne's Episcopal Church in Conway, SC, Dan was active in the Education for Ministry (EFM) programs. At St. Anne's, Dan founded the EFM program and was certified as an EFM counselor by the University of the South in Sewanee, TN.

He is survived by his husband, James Gross and his two step children Jennifer Greenstein (Brad) of Myrtle Beach, SC, and Scott Gross (LaDora Riegel) of Wilmington, DE, and four step grand children — Taylor and Campbell Greenstein and Jade and Odin Riegel-Gross. He is survived by one sister, Pernola McMahan of New Castle, DE, and numerous nieces, nephews, great nieces and nephews, and great great nieces and nephews. Also surviving is Dan's former wife, Bonnie Miller, of Puerto Rico.
